Minibeasts : EYFS Knowledge Mat

Subject Specific Vocabulary	
minibeast	A term used to describe a variety of invertebrates.
insect	A term which describes certain minibeasts that have a three-part body.
thorax	A thorax is a part of a minibeast found between the head and the abdomen.
abdomen	The lower section of a minibeast's body. The abdomen contains all the important organs eg. Heart, respiratory, digestive and reproductive systems.
antennae	Can be called 'feelers'. Antennae are sensory organs on the head used for touch and smell.
invertebrate	Means without a backbone.
proboscis	A long, tube-like straw on top of a minibeast's head used for feeding or sucking.
camouflage	When a minibeast had colourings, shape and texture that allow it to blend into its habitat or surroundings.
habitat	The natural home of any type of animal.

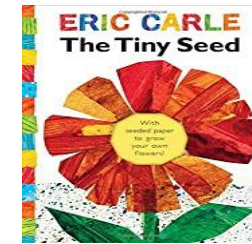
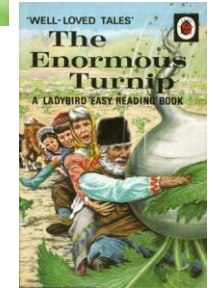
Subject Specific Vocabulary	
seed	A seed is a part of a seed plant that can grow into a new plant.
roots	A root is part of a plant that is found hidden underground. They hold the plant in the ground and keep it upright. They take in water and food in the soil.
stem	The stem is the main part of the plant. It carries the water and food from the roots to the leaves. Petals, fruit or vegetables.
petal	The petal is the coloured part of a flower. With bright colours and smells they usually attract birds and insects.
flower	A flower is sometimes called the bloom or blossom of a plant. Flowers have petals and leaves.
leaf	A leaf is usually the green part of a tree, plant or flower. It is often flat so it gets more light.
plant	A plant is a living thing that you will see wherever you go. Plants include grass, trees, flowers and bushes
sunflower	A sunflower is a tall plant with a large flower head. They are named that way because they turn their heads towards the sun.



Sticky Knowledge about Plants & Growing

- Most plants grow from seeds.
- Most seeds need soil, air, light and water .
- To name the parts of a plant: roots, stem, leaves, petals.
- Some plants spread their seed by birds and insects and some use wind and water to scatter their seed.
- Leaves are so important to a plant's life. They soak up energy from the sun and turn it into food for the plant.

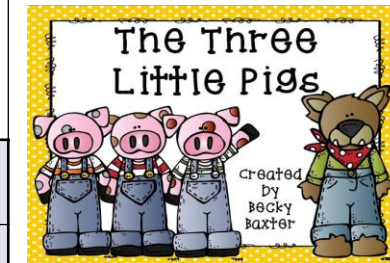
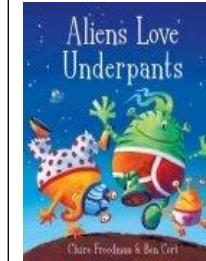
